COUNCIL TAX

With the cost of living, and amounts requested from other statutory bodies to pay for services increasing, the Parish Council is pleased to be able to decrease their element of the council tax again. This year's contribution will be £54.11 down £2.82 from last year for a Band D home. Savings, increases in properties and grants have enabled us to reduce the amount from £65.26 in 2022/3 to £54.11 in 2026/6, for a Band D home. Although your overall council tax will still rise, it shows our commitment to keep costs down as far as possible.

February-March in Your Garden

'Blossom by blossom the Spring begins.'



Spring is now just around the corner, the days are already noticeably longer, and although the weather is still cold, before we know it the blossom will be on the trees and daffodils and crocus will be brightening our gardens. February is the last opportunity for most hedge trimming and tree cutting as by late Feb the birds will begin their nesting season. Make sure any major tree or hedge work is done asap to avoid disturbing any nests. Its also a good time to prune wisteria, by tidying any wispy stems and cutting back flowering spurs to 2 buds.

If you have helped out the overwintering wildlife by leaving the cutting back until spring, then Feb/March is also a good time to get out and cut back old or dead stems and leaves. Pay particular attention to Hellebore, who will look much better once any old brown leaves have been removed to reveal their nodding flowers. Take care when in amongst the beds and borders, ideally working on a dry warm day, to make sure you are not compacting the soil, but also that you are not treading on emerging leaves for those early herbaceous perennials that might be starting into growth. Winter Jasmine & Cornus in particular should also be pruned now to maintain their size and shape and to ensure winter foliage for next year. Hydrangea and Roses should also be pruned back once the weather starts to improve, by removing any old dead growth and cutting back each stem to 2 or 3 outward facing buds.

By March it's time to get started with sowing flower seeds for filling gaps in the borders and for using in pots and baskets. There will already be a vast array of choice in garden centres, so choose something that's suits your requirements and also brings you joy. Summer bulbs will also be available, but wait until April/May before planting out.

In the vegetable garden things really start getting going in Feb. It's the best time to sow Tomatoes and Chillies (keep these warm and protected),

as well as Peas and Broad Beans which will be fine in a greenhouse. Finish pruning Apple and Pear trees by cutting back the previous years growth to a healthy bud as well as removing any dead, damaged or crossing branches. Fruit bushes can also be pruned back in early spring by removing 2-3 yr old growth completely.

Blueberries should also be pruned by March, by removing older growth and cutting back to an outward facing bud. Feb also provides the ideal opportunity to prepare for the coming season, get ahead by ordering seeds (perhaps expand your repertoire and try a few different types of veg) as well as cleaning pots and trays ready for seed sowing. Also spread fresh compost on your beds to improv and nourish the soil for the new season.

By March start chitting early potatoes ready for planting out around easter, as well as sowing successional peas and salads in the greenhouse. It might still be cold in march, so remember to protect any newly emerging seedlings with fleece or a protective covering overnight to protect from frost damage.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

- Uncover and clean ponds of any remaining winter debris, and if it suffers from algae then barley straw is an excellent remedy.
- Feed birds regularly throughout spring as they will be busy nesting as it can be a lifeline in cold conditions. Keep fresh water available too, & defrost it on freezing days.
- Clean and sharpen tools ready for spring, incl mowers and other electricals.
- Remove and snow fall from branches and shrubs, especially if heavy as it can cause breakages.
- Clear any remaining debris from underneath Roses and other shrubs, and spread fresh compost underneath – at least 2” will help to prevent weeds as well as provide nutrients for new growth.
- Recut lawn edges using a half moon.

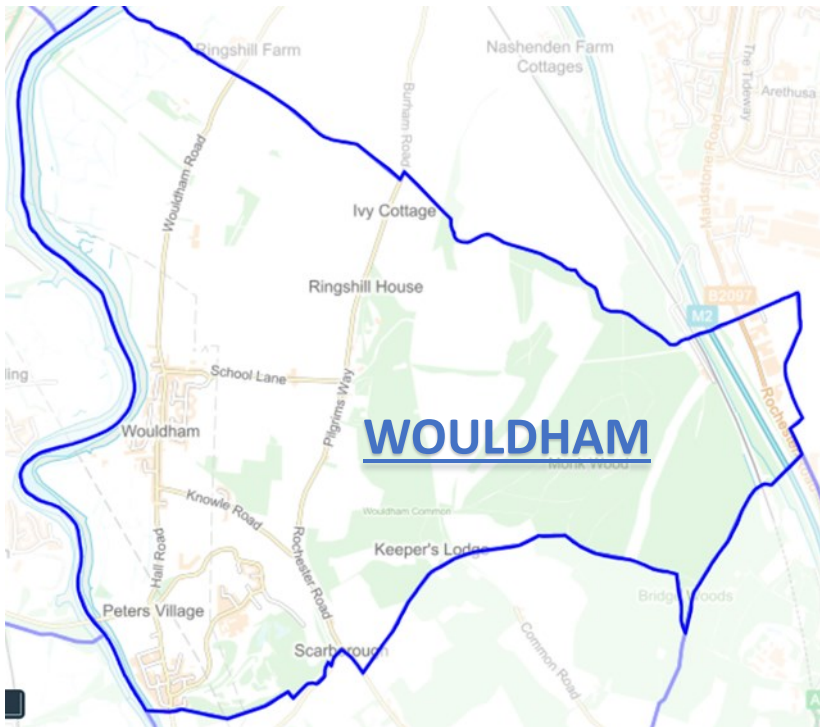
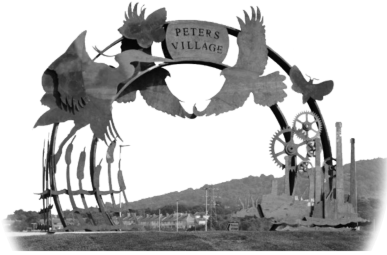
